Guidelines Through January 1st

People In Building: Hockey Practice

- 45 Skaters max per Rink A and B. Rink C is not included in skaters
- Locker Rooms will be selectively used based on Rink Manager and Covid Committee discretion
- While in building all skaters, coaches, employees, and volunteers must maintain social distancing of six feet
- 1 spectator per skater is allowed in the rink while skaters are on the ice for skaters 10U and under. No siblings unless they are under the age of 2.
- No parents are allowed in the building for 12U and older
- Coaches are allowed in rink 30 minutes prior
- Zamboni/Covid Cleaners workers are allowed in rink 15 minutes prior with skaters
- Live Barn is on for your viewing pleasure.
- **If you or your skater are showing any signs of illness or have been in contact with known positives - please stay home!**



Guidelines Through January 1st

Face Coverings

In accordance with the Governor's Emergency Order, the Fond du Lac Blue Line requires face coverings for all people (skaters, volunteers, and coaches) while inside the building.

- Exceptions to the requirement will only be allowed for individuals with medical conditions or other sensory sensitivities that prevent the wearing of a face covering. A medical document must be provided not stating what the condition is but one exists

Guidelines Through January 1st

Entering/Leaving The Rink

- All skaters, volunteers, and coaches must enter through the front entrance.
- Upon entry, skaters will immediately advance to the Staging Area seats in Rink A /B or Locker Rooms
- The Staging Area is where skaters can get their skates and gear on. There will be no privacy in the Staging Area so please be aware of attire worn to the rink.
 - We strongly recommend coming ready to skate with skates on and spending as little time as possible in the staging area
- At the beginning of their assigned time, skaters will be directed by the monitor or team official to enter Rink A/B/C - do not enter this area until instructed to do so.
- When done skating all skaters must exit the building within 15 minutes
 - Please put on your guards, collect your belongings and exit immediately allowing rink to be sanitized before next group enters
 - No showering or lingering of any kind after your ice session has ended
- **If you or your skater are showing any signs of illness or have been in contact with known positives - please stay home!**

Guidelines Through January 1st

Skating & Getting Dressed

- Players are asked to come dressed ready to skate 15 minutes prior to their scheduled ice time.
- We recommend that skaters come with gear on. Staging Area/Locker Rooms are recommended for putting on skates, helmets, and gloves.
- While on the ice all the skaters must maintain a distance of 6 feet apart
- No community water bottles. Each skater must bring own water bottle filled from home
- Any water bottle that is forgotten will be thrown away
- **If your skater is showing any signs of illness or has been in contact with known positives - please keep them home!**




Guidelines Through January 1st Cleaning

- After each session coaches, volunteers, team officials or rink employee MUST disinfect the benches, boards, lobby chairs/benches, and door knobs.
- We recommend that anything that was touched be disinfected.
- After each Zamboni use, the machine is to be disinfected



Guidelines Through January 1st Scheduling

- Skaters may only utilize ice during scheduled times
- Use of any rink during unscheduled times is STRICTLY prohibited.
- Entrance to the Blue Line Family Ice Center is not allowed unless
 - Skater has a scheduled ice time
 - Rink maintenance approved by Rink Manager, President, or Vice President
 - Scheduled volunteer or monitor
 - Skaters/Members are not allowed to use Rink C during unscheduled ice time



Guidelines Through January 1st

Volunteer requirements

- Each hockey team must assign a volunteers for the following positions. Volunteers do not count as a spectator for each skater.
 - Cleaning Crew 1-2 parents
 - Disinfect area getting dressed and benches
 - Team official/monitor
 - Document all skaters at the rink with log
 - Ensure only registered skaters enter rink
 - Ensure skaters maintain social distancing by staying in assigned staging area or locker rooms
 - Escort skaters to Rink A/B/C at designated time
- Zamboni responsibilities
 - Ice prep
 - Sanitize zamboni
- **If you are showing any signs of illness or have been in contact with known positives - please stay home and arrange for someone to cover your slot!**

Guidelines Through January 1st

Hockey Game Policy

Entry Requirements:

Enter 30-minute prior: Coaches (Not Coaches Skaters), Goalies, and Refs

Enter 15-minute prior: Zamboni Drivers, Clock Operators, and Skaters

Enter at scheduled game time: Penalty Box workers and parents (following spectator rule below)

U8 Parents are allowed into the rink 15 minutes prior with the skaters

Masks

All skaters and spectators must wear a mask inside the building

Players must wear a mask on the ice or HECC Approved Helmet

Spectators

2 Spectators per player: **Additional siblings allowed that are 2 and under**

- Example of Allowed 1: 1 adult, 1 child over 2
- Example of Allowed: 1 adult, 1 child over 2, 1 child under 2
- Example of Allowed: 2 adults, 1 child under 2
- Example of NOT ALLOWED: 2 adults, 1 or more children over the age of 2.
- Example of NOT ALLOWED: 1 adult, 2 or more children over the age of 2
- Split families must adhere to the 2 spectators' policy. No exceptions

Temp Checks

Anyone entering the rink must have temperature taken. Anyone over 100.3 will not be admitted to the rink

- If a temperature is over 100.3 parent or skater can go outside for 5 minutes and come back in and try again
