



Coon Rapids Youth Hockey

Eligibility Requirements

The Coon Rapids Youth Hockey (CRYHA) program is open to youths ages 4-18 currently residing within the Coon Rapids high school boundary or receive a waiver to be eligible to register with CRYHA. Members play based on where they attend school and the established Minnesota Hockey affiliate boundaries as defined in the Affiliate Agreements. See Minnesota Hockey Handbook. CRYHA is a participating member of Minnesota Hockey and abides by all Minnesota Hockey and USA Hockey rules and regulations.

Any coach or player who has not turned in his/her equipment or is delinquent with ice bills or fundraising money at the end of the season will not be allowed to participate in future CRYHA functions until he/she has turned in all equipment and is cleared by the Equipment Manager and/or has paid any outstanding ice bills and is cleared by the Treasurer.

Registration

1. Registration will start in late July/early August and run until mid-September for traveling players and until mid-October for Mites and U8s.
2. Female players may register and try out for either the Girls or Boys traveling program. However, players are only allowed to register and try out for one traveling program (either the Girls program or the Boys program). The decision of the program they will be trying out for must be made at the time of registration.
3. All youths wishing to participate in the CRYHA program MUST complete the online registration. Those wishing to play traveling hockey MUST participate in the tryout process as defined in the Coon Rapids Youth Hockey tryout handout at the parent tryout meeting.
4. It is the sole responsibility of the parents/guardian to verify their son/daughter is registered for the correct level of play and playing in the correct association. See Minnesota Hockey Handbook.
5. Players deciding not to play may request a refund of their registration fee, less a \$50 processing fee, prior to the start of tryouts. Please see Refund Policy for more details.
