STANDINGS/POST-SEASON SEEDING

As noted at the District 6 ReStart guidelines, the final league standings will be determined by **winning percentage** verses total points for the 2020-21 season and teams must complete a minimum of 80% of the league scheduled games. Example: 10-game season – teams must complete 8 or of 10 games. The PWAA league is hosted by District 3 which has a 14-game season. Those teams will need to complete 11 games.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE: Standings on the D6 site will display teams ranked by total points (we do not have the ability to manually manipulate the displayed standings to reflect winning percentage). At the conclusion of the season, the District will post a final standing that will rank teams by winning percentage which will apply all tiebreakers necessary to determine the final standings and seeds to post-season competition.

The following is an example of how the Winning Percentage will be applied (including tied games):

Team with 10-0-0 record:	100% winning percentage	(10/10=100%)
Team with 9-1-0 record:	90% winning percentage	(9/10=90%)
Team with 8-0-2 record:	90% winning percentage	(8+.5+.5=9/10=90%)
Team with 7-1-1 record:	83.33% winning percentage	(7+.5=7.5/9=83.33%)

As it relates to any mixed leagues (Bantam AA, Peewee AA, Bantam A, Peewee A), the seeding will be determined by winning percentage within the mixed league – meaning that all games against non-D6 teams will count. Upon the conclusion of the season, we will pull out the non-D6 teams and rank the remaining D6 teams by winning percentage.

Tiebreakers are as follows:

- Teams must complete 80% of their scheduled games
- Standings tiebreakers are:
 1. Fair Play Points earned for all league games.
 2. Head to head competition among the tied teams, determined by points (2 for a win, 1 for a tie, 1 Fair Play point).
 3. Most wins in League play.
 4. Fewest losses in League play.
 5. Largest goal differential among tied teams.
 6. Greatest quotient (goals for divided by goals against among the tied teams).
 7. Largest goal differential for all league play.
 8. Greatest quotient, goals for divided by goals against for all league play.
 9. Flip of a coin done by league official in the presence of the District Director.

POST-SEASON PLAY

District 6 will NOT host playoffs at the BAA, BA, BB1, PWAA, PWA, PWB1, 15A, 15B, 12A, and 12B1 levels. For those levels, District 6 will advance teams directly to Minnesota Hockey Regions and seeded according to final league standings:

Minnesota Hockey has awarded District 6 the following number of seeds:

Bantam AA:	4
Bantam A:	2 **
Bantam B1:	2
Peewee AA:	5
Peewee A:	2
Peewee B1:	2
Girls 15A:	3
Girls 15B:	5
Girls 12A:	2
Girls 12B1:	2

** Bantam A: District 6 has an opportunity to send a 3rd team to MH Regions. The D6 3rd place team in league standings will have the opportunity to complete in a round robin play-in format with the two District 4 teams (Luverne & New Ulm Sleepy Eye). The winner of the round robin event will advance to MN Hockey Regions as the #3 seed. This event will be held in Marshall MN. The D6 team will play both games on the same date to avoid having to travel twice. Date and Times will be announced shortly.

District 6 will host a reduced playoff for BB2, BC, PWB2, PWC, and Girls 12B2 levels

Number of teams advancing to District 6 playoffs are the top 8 teams except for the Girls 12B2 which will include the top 6 teams due to the number of teams.
