GENERAL ITEMS OF INTEREST

The UWHL Classic event was held at the PPL Center in Allentown, PA on January 7th, 2017. The PPL Center is home to the AHL Lehigh Valley Phantoms (AHL team of the Philadelphia Flyers). 19 teams participated in 2 games. The games were 1 hour slots with 12 minute stop-clock periods and time for warmups and photos. Tickets were sold at \$22 each. Teams not participating in the event paid the \$120 buyout fee approved by team representatives at the annual meeting. The Treasurer's Report will reflect profit and expenses for the event.

PLAYOFFS REPORT

Playoffs were held March 25-26, 2017 at Hatfield. This is the first year we held our playoffs at Hatfield, and everyone agreed that it was a much more stable arrangement that we've had in previous years with Iceworks. The 2017 playoffs featured the annual league party, catered by the café at Hatfield. The only change we will be making for next year, is to arrange for none of our UWHL teams to occupy the second story locker rooms in the Green rink that is located across the parking lot from the main Blue and Gray rinks. PhilMar Photography continued their ongoing relationship with the UWHL by taking photos of many of the playoff games.

The UWHL Referee in Chief oversaw scheduling referees for playoffs. We are proud to say that the 2017 playoffs were the first time that all the playoff games were officiated by female referees. Scorekeepers/Timekeepers were scheduled through Hatfield, and were included in the ice cost.

Volunteers from most of the participating playoffs teams were scheduled successfully, and there were few moments that EC members needed to jump in.

In the Red Division, the Bobcats beat the Americans, and would go on to win against the Freeze in the final.

In the White 3 Division, the Hawks beat the Americans, and would go on to win against the Flames.

In the White 2 Division, the Predators beat the Senators, and would go on to win against Queenston in the final.

2016-2017 Season Notes:

The New Jersey Phoenix were accepted into the UWHL at the Blue division level. We have 3 new teams applying for entry into the league. Two teams from the newly formed women's hockey club, the Jaguars, intend to enter a higher and a lower level team. They will play out of the Igloo, in Mt. Holly, NJ. The existing Patriots club are also entering a lower level team.

The UWHL annual meeting is being held at a slightly later date this year, which has actually helped in terms of teams having more information about ice slots and rosters. The EC is proposing to move to a conference system, and combine the Red, White 3, and White 2 divisions into one conference (Red), and the White 1 and Blue divisions into a different conference (Blue). This will be voted on during the annual meeting on August 13, 2017. This was proposed to address the ongoing issue of league growth and the least and most skilled levels of play.
