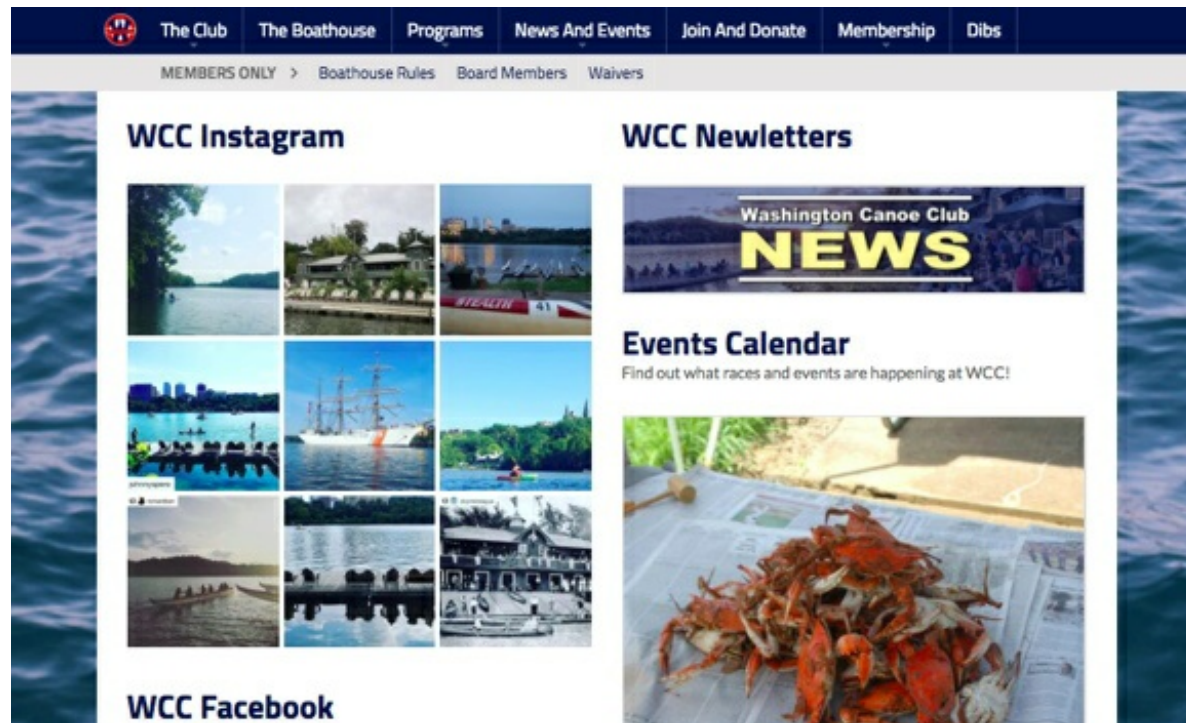

August 26th - Broadkill River Canoe and Kayak Race in Milton, DE: (Theresa Haught, Will Rhodes, Bill Woodruff, Becca Pinkus) placed 1st in the C4 and Lisa Ramm and Louise Flynn placed 1st and 2nd respectively in women's kayak.

August 31st to September 4th - Queen Lili'uokalani Canoe Races in Kailua Kona, Hawaii: WCC Men's team placed 12th in division and 40th overall out of 96 boats in the Saturday OC6 race, while Luke Rhodes placed 5th in division and 9th among OC1s on Sunday.
