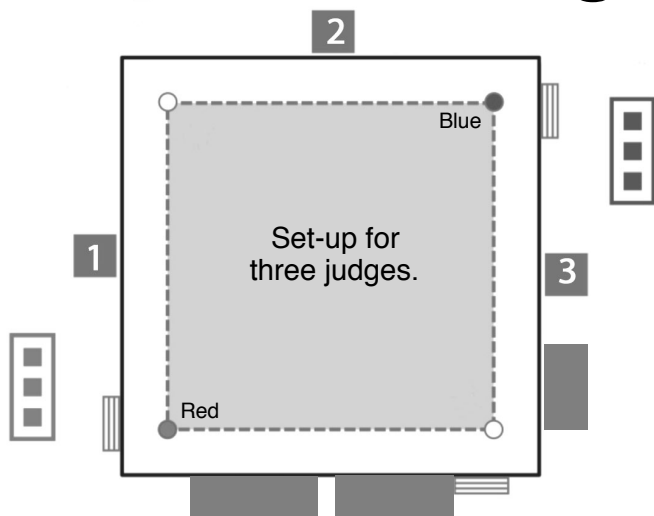


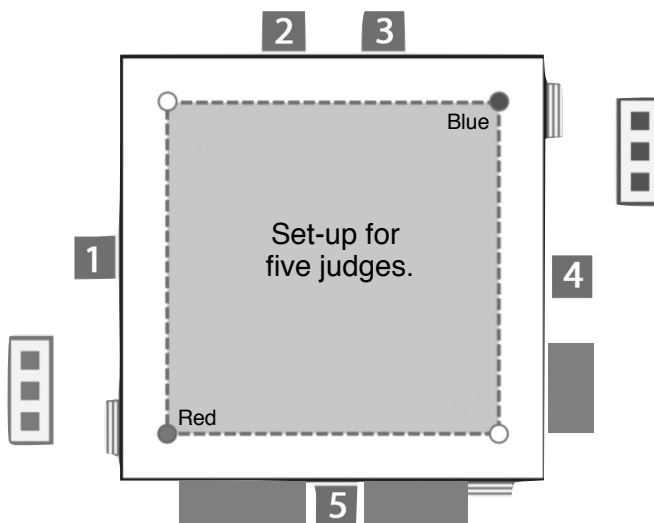
# Ring set-up for Club Shows



## Ring set-up checklist:

- ✓ Regulation ring\* & Accessories\*\*
- ✓ Transport to venue
- ✓ Schedule ring set-up — labor and time required to assemble (complete a minimum of 3 hours prior to event start for inspection and adjustment)
- ✓ Ring take-down — labor and time to disassemble and load for transport
- ✓ Transport to return ring and unload

\* **Ring Regulations** (see USA Boxing National Rulebook for complete list of regulations)  
 16', 18', or 20' square within the ropes, at least 4 ropes, & 2 spacer ties on each side.  
 Ropes a minimum of 1" in diameter and wrapped in soft material.  
 Ropes spaced 18", 30", 42", and 54" above the ring floor.  
 Ring floor padded with 1" layer of closed cell foam rubber or chemical equivalent.  
 Padding covered with canvas, duck, or similar material, stretched and secured.  
 Turnbuckles covered. Ring apron must extend a minimum of 2' beyond the ropes.  
 Ring floor may not be higher than 4' above the floor.  
 Three sets of steps — for red & blue corners and for the ringside doctor.  
 • Keep ring tools and materials available during the event in case of ring repair.



## \*\* Required ring accessories:

- 1) chairs & tables for supervisor, clerk, timekeeper, doctor, judges, announcer
- 2) non-transparent small plastic bag in neutral corners
- 3) three chairs for coaches in red & blue corners
- 4) stool & plastic bucket for red & blue corners
- 5) sounding device (bell) and clacker (may be provided by the Chief of Officials)
- 6) two stopwatches (may be provided by the Timekeeper or USIBA COO)
- 7) scoring system (electronic or manual — will be provided by USIBA COO)
- 8) first-aid supplies, oxygen, & stretcher

Towels recommended to assist coaches in cleaning spills.

Finished ring size: A complete ring set-up for the smallest competition ring (a 20' platform measuring 16' inside the ropes) requires 1,296 ft<sup>2</sup> & 16' of ceiling clearance.
