TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team faces Denmark here tonight in its second of three preliminary round games at the XXV Olympic Winter Games. Team USA is the home team, will wear its blue jersey and occupy the left bench (from the player's perspective looking onto the ice). Tonight's game will be televised live on USA Network and streamed live on Peacock.

TALKING POINTS

A NEW OLYMPIC OPPONENT IN DENMARK

The U.S. and Denmark have never met in the Olympic Winter Games in men's hockey. The Danish men's hockey team has been in just one previous Olympic tournament, that in 2022 where it finished seventh. The U.S. faced Denmark in the 2025 IIHF Men's World Championship and earned a 5-0 victory in the preliminary round. At the men's senior level, the U.S. is 8-0-1-1-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T), with all games coming in the world championship.

TIDBITS

The U.S. had a morning pre-game skate today at 12 noon after not practicing yesterday. Team USA got back to the Olympic Village at 1:15 a.m. after its game Wednesday against Latvia ... Brady Tkachuk scored the first goal of the Olympic tournament for the U.S. on Wednesday in its 5-1 win over Latvia. He also scored the first goal for Team USA in last February's 4 Nations Face-Off. It came at 10:21 of the first period in a 6-1 victory over Finland on Feb. 13, 2025, at the Bell Centre in Montreal.

REWIND

Team USA earned a 5-1 win over Latvia to open play in the Olympic tournament on Wednesday. Four different players scored with Brock Nelson leading the way with two goals. Four players had two assists, including Jack and Quinn Hughes, Matthew Tkachuk and Jack Eichel, while Connor Hellebuyck stopped 17 of 18 shots he faced in the contest. It was just the second meeting ever between the two countries in Olympic play after a 3-3 tie to start the preliminary round of the 2006 Olympic tournament in Torino, Italy.

BROCK NELSON AND THE OLYMPICS

Brock Nelson is part of one of the most storied hockey families in the U.S. From Warroad, Minnesota, Nelson is the fifth member of his family to play for the U.S. in the Olympic Winter Games.

- His grandfather, **Bill Christian**, and great-uncle, **Roger Christian**, won gold at the 1960 Squaw Valley Olympics.
- His uncle, **Dave Christian**, was a standout on the "Miracle on Ice" team that earned gold at the 1980 Lake Placid Olympics. Dave arrived in Milan today with his wife Lisa and is expected to be at tonight's contest.
- His great-uncle, **Gordon Christian**, earned an Olympic silver medal as part of Team USA in the 1956 Games in Cortina, Italy.

Business Enterprise

Bill and Roger Christian founded the Christian Brothers Hockey Company, which manufactured hockey sticks in 1964, before selling the company in 2002. In the mid-1980s, the company produced approximately 500,000 sticks annually and was known for manufacturing wooden sticks used by NHL legends like Bobby Hull and Bobby Orr.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY CONNECTION

Team USA's ties to Boston University are significant with five players and five staff having connectivity to the Terrier men's hockey program. Players Jack Eichel, Clayton Keller, Charlie McAvoy, Jake Oettinger and Brady Tkachuk all competed at BU, while staff members Mike Sullivan, David Quinn, John Hynes, Chris Drury and Chris Kelleher either played and/or coached at BU.

VALENTINE'S DAY

The U.S. has played four previous games on Valentine's Day in the Olympics and has a 2-2 record.

SWAYMAN TO GET START

Jeremy Swayman, who backstopped the U.S. to its first gold in the IIHF Men's World Championship in 92 years this past May, will get the call in net tonight. The Anchorage, Alaska, native was 7-0 in the 2025 World Championship with a 1.69 goals against average and .921 save percentage. While the U.S. faced Denmark in the 2025 Worlds, Swayman did not play in that contest; Joey Daccord did and had a 26-save shutout in a 5-0 win. Swayman is 22-13-2 (2.92, .903) with the NHL's Boston Bruins this season. He was part of Team USA for the 4 Nations Face-Off last February, but did not play.

U.S. WOMEN GETTING SET FOR SEMIFINALS

The U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team is coming off its fourth straight shutout of the Games with a 6-0 victory over Italy in last night's (Feb. 13) quarterfinals played at Milano Rho Ice Arena. Team USA will play in the semifinals at 4:40 p.m. local/10:40 a.m. ET against a yet-to-be-determined opponent at Santagiulia Ice Arena. NBC will carry the game live and all Olympic hockey games are streamed live by Peacock. The U.S. men's and women's lockerrooms are right next to each other at Santagiulia.

AVERAGE AGE OF U.S. OLYMPIC TEAMS

The 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team has an average age of 28.42 and is the fifth oldest on record. Brock Faber, born Aug. 22, 2002, is the youngest member of the squad and was one of four 19-year-olds on the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Hockey Team. Brock Nelson, at 34, is the oldest.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward **Auston Matthews** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) is the captain of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is in his 10th season playing for the Toronto Maple Leafs and is the most prolific goal scorer in the NHL since his arrival. Matthew Tkachuk, an alternate captain for the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Florida Panthers is serving as an alternate captain as is Charlie McAvoy, who is an alternate captain for the Boston Bruins. The leadership group is the same three players the U.S. utilized for last February's 4 Nations Face-Off.



DID YOU KNOW -- JACK HUGHES

Did you know U.S. forward **Jack Hughes** played in all three major IIHF world championships in the 2018-19 season? Below is an entry from the USA Hockey game notes vault from May of 2019.

Jack Hughes is the fourth player in IIHF history to play in the Under-18 Men's World Championship, World Junior Championship and Men's World Championship in the same season, joining Switzerland's Kevin Fiala and Vadim Karaga and Andrei Kostitsy from Belarus. Hughes is the youngest American to ever play for a U.S. team in the top-level men's world championship.

TIDBITS FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

The U.S. had three full practices and a morning skate prior to its opening game ... Team USA includes just two players with Olympic experience in defenseman **Brock Faber** and **Jake Sanderson**, both who were part of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Said Faber, "Its my second time, but it feels like the first." The 2022 Beijing Games were the "COVID" games and played in a "bubble" without friends and family ... **Ellen Hughes**, mother of Jack and Quinn Hughes, is the performance consultant for the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team. Ellen played on the 1992 U.S. Women's National Team and has been working with the U.S. Women's National Team program since October 2023 ... **Pat Kelleher**, executive director of USA Hockey, arrived last Thursday (Feb. 5) and is here for the duration of the Games. His brother, Chris, is the director of player personnel for the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team ... **Mike Trimboli** (Massena, N.Y.), president of USA Hockey, arrived today and will be here for the rest of the Games ... U.S. defenseman **Quinn Hughes** likes to read, but shares that he doesn't read on game days, calling it bad luck ... A good number of players had the chance to meet **Snoop Dogg** on Feb. 10 in the Olympic Village. Snoop is serving as the honorary coach for the entirety of Team USA and came to the U.S. athlete resource center to show support and provide some words on inspiration ... **Brij Singh**, who is serving as team leader of the U.S. Olympic Men's Hockey Team for the second straight Games, is believed to be the first Turban Sikh to be part of any Winter Games official team delegation ... Players have taken the opportunity to go to women's hockey, speed skating and figure skating while here in Milan.

OPENING CEREMONIES; MEETING VICE PRESIDENT

Charlie McAvoy, **Jeremy Swayman**, **Jake Oettinger** and **Zach Werenski** flew over ahead of the rest of the team to attend the Opening Ceremonies. The trio left NYC the evening of Feb. 5 and arrived in Milan the morning of Feb. 6. The next day (Feb. 7), the four had a private audience with U.S. Vice President Vance and then went to the Starbucks Winter House to sit down to do enjoy lunch and do a few select interviews. The rest of Team USA arrived in Milan on Feb. 8.

ALL-TIME IN OPENING GAMES

In its first game of an Olympic tournament, the U.S. is 12-0-2-8-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T), including a 5-1 win in its first game of these 2026 Olympic Winter Games. The U.S. has won five of its last seven Olympic-tournament opening games.

Team USA includes two sets of brothers – **Matthew** (Florida Panthers) and **Brady** (Ottawa Senators) **Tkachuk** and **Quinn** (Minnesota Wild) and **Jack** (New Jersey Devils) **Hughes**. The only other time a U.S. Olympic men's hockey team has had two sets of brothers was on the 1960 gold medal-winning squad (Squaw Valley) with Bill and Roger Christian and Bill and Bob Cleary.




Series vs. Latvia: 0-0-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T)

Of Note: Team USA will face Latvia for just the second time ever with the only other meeting a 3-3 tie in the 2006 Games.

FEB. 15, 2006: USA 3, LAT 3: The U.S. had a 42-25 shots on goal advantage but settled for a tie. Goals came from Brian Gionta, Craig Conroy and Jordan Leopold. John Grahame had 22 saves in goal for the U.S.

DENMARK



Series vs. Denmark: 0-0-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T)

Of Note: The U.S. will face Denmark in the Olympic Winter Games for the first time ever.

Denmark is making just its second-ever appearance in the Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Tournament after debuting in 2022 in Beijing, where it finished seventh.

Series vs. Germany: 9-0-0-1-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T)

Of Note: Team USA has outscored Germany 53-11 and has tallied five or more goals in six matchups.

FEB. 13, 2022: USA 3, GER 2: Drew Comness made 24 saves and Team USA got goals from Steven Kampfer, Matthew Knies and Nathan Smith to finish unbeaten in the preliminary round.

FEB. 16, 2022: SVK 3, USA 2 (SO): The U.S. lost a heartbreaker in a shootout and finished the Olympic Tournament without a regulation loss. The U.S. got 34 saves from Strauss Mann with goals from Nick Abruzzese and Sam Hentges.

Of Note: The U.S. has faced three different teams (Russia, Finland and Canada) in its last three semifinal appearances at the Olympic Winter Games.

FEB. 21, 2014: CAN 1, USA 0: Jonathan Quick stopped 36 of the 37 shots he faced but Team USA fell to Canada, 1-0, in the semifinals of the 2014 Olympic Winter Games.

2026 OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES

The U.S. is one of 12 teams competing at the 2026 Olympic Winter Games.

The tournament features 12 teams divided into three groups of four. Team USA is competing in Group C alongside Germany, Latvia and Denmark. Group A includes Canada, Czechia, Switzerland and France, while Group B features Finland, Sweden, Slovakia and Italy.

The teams will play round-robin within their group, with four teams earning byes to the quarterfinal round and eight teams playing qualification games to earn quarterfinal spots. The winners of the four quarterfinal contests advance to the semifinals, and the two semifinal winners will square off in the gold-medal game while the two semifinal losers will meet for bronze.

ABOUT THE NTDP

Founded in 1996, USA Hockey's National Team Development Program began operations in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and remained there until the summer of 2015, when it moved to its current home at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Mich. The full-time program is composed of two squads, the U.S. National Under-18 Team and U.S. National Under-17 teams, which compete in the USHL as well as against international and collegiate competition. The Under-17 Team competes in the United States Hockey League and also participates in three international events annually. The U.S. National Under-18 Team's schedule includes games against NCAA Division I and III opponents, contests versus USHL teams as well as competition in three international tournaments.

2026 PARALYMPIC WINTER GAMES

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team has been training in Boulder, Colo., since the beginning of January in preparation for the Paralympic Winter Games, which are set for March 6-15 in Milan. The U.S. has won gold in the last four Paralympic Winter Games, an unprecedented feat.

HOCKEY WEEKEND ACROSS AMERICA

Hockey Week Across America will be held a week later than typical to take advantage of the visibility provided by the Olympic Winter Games. The week-long celebration and will feature a theme for each of the three days, including USA Day on Monday (March 2); Stick Salute Day on Tuesday (March 3), Hockey Is For Everyone Day (March 4), Volunteer Appreciation Day (March 5), Hockey Jersey Day (March 6), Try Hockey For Free Day (March 7) and Welcome To Hockey Day (March 8). Hockey Week Across America was started by USA Hockey in 2008 to engage the hockey community in celebrating the game at all levels and exposing the sport to new audiences.

Quinn Hughes leads all NHL players in time on ice (27:51), followed by **Werenski** (26:21), who ranks second.

Matt Boldy is tied for third in the NHL and first among Americans in goals (32).

Jack Eichel leads all American NHL players in points (68) and ranks 10th in the NHL in points.

Dylan Larkin ranks third in the NHL in face-offs won (623) and first among Americans. He is also third in the NHL in game-winning goals (7).
