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Unique Futsal Rules



Substitutions – Unlimited and on the fly. Subs must occur strictly within the substitution zone (5m).

The exiting player must fully leave through the zone before the substitute enters, and the pinnie must be handed over (not thrown). Improper substitution results in a yellow card and an indirect free kick for the opponent from the spot where play stopped.

Accumulated fouls – Each team may commit 5 direct-free-kick fouls per half. Any foul beyond that (6th or more) becomes either a 10m second-penalty-mark kick or a direct free kick with no wall, depending on the foul location.

Goalkeeper 4-second rule – Goalkeepers may only have possession for 4 seconds in their own half.

Goalkeeper restriction after release – Once the goalkeeper releases the ball, they cannot receive it again in their own half until it touches an opponent or goes out of play.

Goal clearance – The ball is in play immediately when released by the goalkeeper (it does not need to leave the penalty area). It may be thrown beyond the halfway line.

Sending-off (red card) – The player cannot return. The team plays short for up to 2 minutes unless the opponent scores before the 2 minutes expire, in which case a substitute may enter immediately.

4-second restart rule – All restarts must be taken within 4 seconds, except for kick-offs and 6m penalty kicks.

Dropped ball – A goal cannot be scored directly; the ball must touch another player before entering the net.
