



Parent Code of Conduct

Northwest Guilford Youth Football Association (NWGYFA) is committed to providing an inspiring and positive football experience for everyone involved. The following “Code of Conduct” is intended to clearly establish the standards and expectations we have as an organization for all our Parents:

- As a Parent you will encourage good sportsmanship and demonstrate a positive attitude.
- You will treat everyone with courtesy, dignity and respect.
- Treat others as you’d want to be treated. Be the thermostat, not the thermometer.
- Remember that children participate to have fun, and this association is for them, not you.
- If your child cannot attend an event or you cannot volunteer at an event that you were assigned, or if you are going to be late, you must notify your head coach or team parent. Any unexcused absences could result loss of playing privileges.
- Display a modest temper and refrain from any emotional outburst.
- Respect your child’s coaching staff, league members and volunteers, other parents and family members. If you have an issue with coaching, wait until after practice to discuss with the coach in a respectful manner. If the issue is not resolved, contact the NWGYFA Board for discussion. Making a scene in front of any coaches, players or families is strictly prohibited.
- Strive to model and exhibit respectful behavior towards the opposing team, coaches or officials at any time.
- Keep things in perspective. This is a game where no contracts are awarded. Teach your child that honest effort is as important as victory. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- When you register your child to play complete commitment is expected. Commitment to our athletes, to your team, to the organization, and to the community. Be prepared to give your full participation by volunteering with concessions, gate, positions during games, groundskeeping, cleanup, fundraising and other events/responsibilities as needed.

Penalties for Violations

FIRST VIOLATION: Verbal warning from the Northwest Football Association Leader

2ND VIOLATION: Written documentation will be delivered to the Parent and meeting will be held, with the Association Board of Directors, to discuss matter in clear detail including possible suspension.

3ND VIOLATION: Parent is suspended for the rest of the season

** In the event a Parent is suspended, he or she, will not be allowed to attend or observe practices or games. Once a Parent is suspended they will serve the entire suspension without exception.

Zero Tolerance Policy

It is the responsibility of ALL Parents to maintain the highest standards of conduct for themselves at all times on and off the field. Any incidents of fighting or physical aggression towards any adult or child will not be tolerated and will result in permanent suspension from the association and quite possibly legal action.
