



## Chaska Community Center Ice Arena COVID Guidelines

Update: 2/17/2021

- **Prior to rental groups first ice rental, they must provide written acknowledgement of fully understanding these guidelines below. This will be kept on file with CCC Arena Supervisor. If changes are made to guidelines, CCC Arena Supervisor will send out revised updates. User groups must submit acknowledgement of receipt and willingness to follow guidelines.**
- Per Minnesota Department of Health; rental groups will be limited to two pods of 25 people on the ice at a time if using shared ice. If group is using full ice, no more than 25 people on the ice.
- Masks are to be worn by all individuals at all times regardless the level of physical exertion per executive order 20-103.
- Water bottle filling stations will be available for use. Water fountain spouts will not be available for use.
- There will be no lost and found items kept. All lost and found items will be discarded at the end of an evening.
- Participants will enter through the Arena Doors (Door #1) and exit through the properly labeled exit doors of the arena. For youth events, a coach, instructor, or team manager is to enter facility with a group for communication purposes.
- At this time, one adult per player is allowed for practice sessions. Sibling(s) are allowed only if absolutely necessary but must stay at parent's side. Parent and siblings of participants age 10 and older are highly encouraged not to attend practice sessions.
- For games and scrimmages at all levels, 2 adults per player are allowed for home team and away team. Siblings are allowed only if absolutely necessary but must stay at parent's side. Spectators are to enter at start of game time, with exception of goalie parents if child needs equipment assistance. Home team managers are to submit emailed spectator (including siblings attending) home and away attendance form to [arena@chaskamn.com](mailto:arena@chaskamn.com) by 12 noon on day of event. Spreadsheet/form must include name, phone number and/or email of all spectators attending day's event.
- Skaters are to enter facility fully dressed. Lockers rooms are not available at this time. It is highly recommended to enter facility full dressed in protective equipment & skate guards on and ready to skate. Limited seating is available for putting on skates or skate tying and used on a first come first serve basis by users. Goalies are highly recommended to come dressed in skates and breezers on. Goalies can put on leg pads and chest protector on inside facility.
- Equipment bags are not allowed for youth hockey association events with exception for goalies, per Minnesota Hockey guidelines. One small drawstring bag or school size backpack is allowed. All bags brought into facility are to be brought to player boxes, not stored in skate tying area or arena lobbies, or Rink 2 bleachers while on the ice. CCC is not responsible for lost or stolen items brought into the

facility.

- Arena lobbies are not to be used for dressing and bag storage to allow for adequate social distancing and clear pathways.
- Goalies and officials are allowed to enter arena 15 minutes prior to start of ice time. All other skaters, coaches, or game operations personnel are to remain out of facility until 10 minutes prior to start of ice time.
- Skaters, adults, and groups are asked to leave the facility within 5 minutes of their ice time ending.
- For games, only those responsible for the game operations are to come into building with team. This is to minimize the amount of crossover between teams, potential congregation in confined areas, and limit exposure time to others in facility.
- To allow for proper cleaning and disinfection of common touchpoints between ice rental groups, the group that comes off the ice must be completely out of common areas (on benches, score table area, etc) prior to the next group being allowed onto the ice. The next group on the ice should not enter these areas until allowed to do so.
- Dryland training, warm up, stickhandling, shooting, skating harness use will not be allowed in common areas of arenas.
- Rental groups willfully disregarding these guidelines or be disrespectful to CCC staff during their visit may result in cancellation of ice rentals without refund.
- CCC has the right to ask spectators and players to exit facility should they arrive earlier than allowed or capacity limits be exceeded at any time.
- CCC will not issue refunds for cancelled ice times due to limited skaters due to spread of COVID-19 or precautions being taken stated in these guidelines.
