



MINOT HOCKEY BOOSTERS(MHB) 2020-2021 COVID-19 COMMUNICATION PROCEDURE AND RESPONSE PROTOCOL

MHB has identified Brian Bauman, Program Director, as point of contact (POC), or some other designated representative appointed by Brian, for questions from Members of MHB regarding COVID-19 as it relates to all MHB activities, and for the Communication Procedure listed below.

Brian Bauman, Program Director
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Communications:

- a) If a player, coach, team manager or immediate family test positive for COVID-19, POC should be notified by the individual, or the individual's parent, guardian or family member.
- b) POC shall immediately notify the players, coaches and team manager for the team that has a positive test, stating that an individual of the team has tested positive (no other information about the individual is to be given). FDPH or another similar agency will be responsible for contact tracing. Team activities will be suspended for 24 hours, or possibly more to ensure contact tracing can be completed. If you are contacted by a tracer please take the call, answer all questions and follow the guidance of the public health official.
- c) POC, will notify the team manager and coach and have them determine how many coaches and players are able to participate.
- d) POC, coaches and manager shall not share any medical information of any individual. POC may share player, coach and manager contact information with the local public health officials, if requested, to aid in the contact tracing process.

Response Protocol for Positive COVID-19 Test or Close Contact:

- a) If a player, coach or team manager tests positive for COVID-19, that individual must not attend any MHB activities and should assist and cooperate with FDHU or any other similar agency responsible for contact tracing. MHB recommends the individual who tested positive follow the advice of the local public health officials. POC to determine if the individual who tested positive was at a rink two

days prior to symptom onset, or positive test result if asymptomatic, until the time of isolation, and if so the POC should notify the rink manager and any other authority in charge of the rink of a positive test.

- b) If a manager, coach, player or family member of a player, coach or manager has been notified by a public health official that the individual is a close contact to a person who tested positive for COVID-19, said individual should follow the direction of their healthcare professional. If the symptomatic individual tests positive for COVID-19, the communication procedure above will be followed.
- c) If a player, manager or coach becomes symptomatic while at a team event, that individual shall immediately leave the team event, or be isolated from others while waiting for a parent or guardian to pick up the individual. Said individual should follow the advice of their healthcare professional. If said individual subsequently tests positive for COVID-19, the communication procedure above will be followed.

*List of possible symptoms associated with COVID-19, as described by the NDDOH, include but are no limited to:

- Fever
- Cough
- Difficulty Breathing
- Loss of taste/smell
- Sore Throat
- Body Aches
- Headache
- Chills
- Diarrhea
- Nausea/vomiting
