CLASS OF 1968/COACH

Jerome Dtviler participated in football and track & field while attending Park High School, but he is best known for his efforts as a long-time coach of soccer, Nordic skiing and track and field. While his teams were very successful, his ability to nurture a love for the sport in his athletes is what made him an outstanding coach.

Jerome is an Augsburg College graduate with a degree in Education. He has Master's Degrees from both St. Thomas and Hamline Universities. He taught social studies at Park for 34 years. Jerome was the first coach of the Park Nordic ski team and from 1991-1998 coached teams from both Park and Woodbury. While he served as an assistant coach in the girls' soccer program, the team won a state title in 1990, and Jerome was selected as MSHSSCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 1997.

Jerome holds the record for being selected the most number of times by the senior class to give the commencement address at Park High School. To date, there are 1,556 members on Facebook supporting Jerome Dtviler. JD has had an impact on many students who have gone through the halls of Park High School, not only as an instructor, but as a coach, mentor, and friend.

CLASS OF 1979

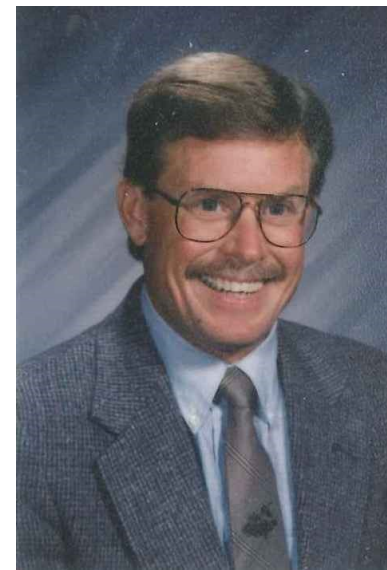
Timothy Scanlan was a three sport stand-out at Park, participating in football, basketball, and track and field. He continued his athletic career at the University of Minnesota as a high jumper his freshman year and a member of the JV basketball team his sophomore year. He is currently the Vice President of Event Production at ESPN and in 2003, won an Emmy Award for Technical Achievement. Overseeing production of the World Cup in South Africa in 2010 is a highlight of his career at ESPN thus far, and his entire production team has garnered a number of Emmy nominations.

Although his days as a team sport player have come to an end, sports and fitness are a priority for him. About 10 years ago, he began training for his first marathon – Grandma’s Marathon in Duluth in June, 2002. He has since completed five more marathons, the most recent being the Twin Cities Marathon in October, 2011 to benefit the Livestrong Organization.

Bill Hare

CLASS OF 1961

Bill Hare graduated from St. Paul Park High School in 1961 and from Hamline University in 1965. In 1981, he earned a Master’s Degree from St. Cloud State University. He was an accomplished high school and collegiate athlete, earning 10 letters in high school, and was a four-year letter winner in baseball at Hamline.

He began his teaching and coaching career at Mounds View in 1965 and went to Greenway Schools in Coleraine, MN in 1972. His baseball teams earned four state championships and one runner-up finish. He has been selected state baseball coach of the year four times and nominated for national coach of the year three times. He was Region 7 Athletic Director of the Year in 1993. He is a member of the Hamline University Athletic Hall of Fame, the MSHSCA Hall of Fame, the MN Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, and the MN Athletic Directors Hall of Fame.

Acceptance Remarks:

Park High. Truly a special place for me. The school was almost the perfect size. It was large enough to offer all the significant programs and small enough to be extremely friendly. The time I attended, we were on a unique “split shift” program. This allowed both students and faculty to have considerable time to use for outside activities. In my life, that meant that I could play football, basketball, and baseball and be in the class plays, choir and other significant activities.

Several faculty members played important roles in my development. My coaches, Mr. Smith, Mr. Sazama, Mr. Larsen and special teachers, Mr. Moriarty, Mr. Lynch, Miss Belliveau and choir director, Mr. Parrish (who sang at our wedding), all shared in creating a positive learning atmosphere. I have been very lucky in my professional career. I have had the opportunity to coach and teach with quality adults and students. The success of our baseball program at Greenway High School most certainly played the major role in my selection for this honor. I would like to thank my mom and dad for their support and guidance in my youth and my wife, Rhoda, for hers ever since. Thanks to the committee for granting me this meaningful and special recognition.



Norman H. Larsen
COACH/ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Norm Larsen was the head football coach at St. Paul Park High School for ten years, accumulating a 59-23-2 record and four conference championships. He led the 1959 team to an undefeated 9-0 season. After his coaching career, Norm continued to serve as Park's Athletic Director until his retirement in 1977. Norm was instrumental in establishing the "Citizens for Lights" committee which raised money for lights at the Oltman field and is still giving away scholarship money to District 833 students today.

After attending high school in Superior, Wisconsin, Norm attended Augsburg College and played football as a 135 lb. wingback. His coaching career took him to Manterville High and Preston High Schools before he began his tenure at Park High School. His overall coaching record is 103-36-3 and he is a member of the Augsburg Hall of Fame.

Dad spent thirty years as a fine teacher, highly successful coach, and respected athletic director. His influence was felt by many over the years, not the least of which was his son and grandson, who followed his lead into teaching and coaching. After retirement, Dad spent an additional twenty-five years as an influential member of the Scholarship for Lights, a scholarship meant to help student-athletes in the district and to highlight District 833.

What more could one ask of a Hall of Fame inductee? Norm Larsen spent fifty-five years in education, forty-eight at Park. He was successful and he always had the best interests of the district in mind. His impact is still seen in South Washington County. This is a well deserved induction.



Leslie (Bloedel) Mollner
CLASS OF 1989

Leslie (Bloedel) Mollner was a three-year state meet participant in diving while at Park and finished 11th in state her senior year. She also excelled at gymnastics, where she led her teams to two state-meet appearances and was an individual state champion in the vault in 1989. Leslie twice earned All-American honors at Gustavus Adolphus College, leading her gymnastics team to four straight Division III national championships.

Leslie is a graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College with a BA in Psychology, and has two Master's Degrees from the University of Minnesota in Sports Psychology and from the University of Wisconsin in Library Science.
